

Notes on the Sound of Music

The final collaboration between Rodgers & Hammerstein was destined to become the world's most beloved musical. When a postulant proves too high-spirited for the religious life, she is dispatched to serve as governess for the seven children of a widowed naval Captain. Her growing rapport with the youngsters, coupled with her generosity of spirit, gradually captures the heart of the stern Captain, and they marry. Upon returning from their honeymoon they discover that Austria has been invaded by the Nazis, who demand the Captain's immediate service in their navy. The family's narrow escape over the mountains to Switzerland on the eve of World War II provides one of the most thrilling and inspirational finales ever presented in the theatre. The motion picture version remains the most popular movie musical of all time.

We give thanks to you, O God, for the goodness and love which you have made known to us in creation; in the calling of Israel to be your people; in your Word spoken through the prophets; and above all in the Word made flesh, Jesus, your Son. For in these last days you sent him to be incarnate from the Virgin Mary, to be the Savior and Redeemer of the world. In him, you have delivered us from evil, and made us worthy to stand before you. In him, you have brought us out of error into truth, out of sin into righteousness, out of death into life.

On the night before he died for us, our Lord Jesus Christ took bread; and when he had given thanks to you, he broke it, and gave it to his disciples, and said, "Take, eat: This is my Body, which is given for you. Do this for the remembrance of me."

After supper he took the cup of wine; and when he had given thanks, he gave it to them, and said, "Drink this, all of you: This is my Blood of the new Covenant, which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins. Whenever you drink it, do this for the remembrance of me."

In the fullness of time, put all things in subjection under your Christ, and bring us to that heavenly country where, with all your saints, we may enter the everlasting heritage of your sons and daughters; through Jesus Christ our Lord, the firstborn of all creation, the head of the Church, and the author of our salvation. By him, and with him, and in him, in the unity of the Holy Spirit all honor and glory is yours, Almighty Father, now and for ever. **AMEN.**

Nave Improvement Project Update

The **Nave Improvement Committee** met on June 26, 2018 and affirmed the color choices for the painting portion of this project. We have color boards available in the sanctuary for all to see. These colors were chosen to accentuate the stained glass windows, the mosaic floor – especially the circle medallion, the paintings, and the entire chancel.

When considering paint color choices, we recognized that the mortar color of the mosaic floor contrasts with each stone and draws our attention to the multiple colors of the mosaic floor. We have chosen lighter shades of this mortar color to help draw out the various colors of each of the visual resources listed above, but not compete with the windows, mosaic floor, or chancel paintings.

When we enter the sanctuary for worship, the windows, mosaic floor, and chancel paintings help to create a place in which we find comfort and solace. The chosen paint colors will complement and enhance the colors in each of these visual resources. Our goal is to create a sense of invitation to appreciate our spiritual resources and to feel a sense of calmness as worship begins.

It is time to start!

Much of the money that has been donated to date has been designated to both painting and lighting. This dual designation will help us schedule the work as we move forward. We plan to take advantage of the time available this summer to accomplish some of the lighting and the painting. We will begin during the week of July 9th with lighting work in the balcony. The painting will begin on July 23rd and continue through August 17th. This will necessitate moving our worship services to Blake Hall for four Sundays, beginning on July 22nd.

Additionally, we plan to order the chandeliers, placing a 30% deposit this summer. The planned delivery of the chandeliers will be later this fall. The installation of the chandeliers will be completed during the week and not disrupt Sunday services.


